For 35 years, Jean-Pierre Dutilleux has been filming and photographing, around the world, the remaining human groups still living away from the modern world.

With his latest exhibit, the ethnographer highlights twelve exceptional ethnic groups from Asia, Africa and Amazonia. For the first time, he presents some large prints installed amidst artifacts he brought back to recreate a little of the natural environment of these tribes. A 26 minutes documentary will be screened alongside each tribe.

This exhibition also shows the commitment of Jean Pierre Dutilleux for the protection of these isolated tribal groups and their environment. It has the ambition to share with the audience some of their vast knowledge of the natural world before it is lost.

To get to the Cultural Centre of the Abbey of Neumünster, it is recommended to use the car parks that are in the upper city of Luxembourg or the Clausen parking by the river-bank.

From the plateau of Saint-Esprit, a free elevator will take you down to the Grund area, about 300 feet away from the Cultural Centre of the Abbey of Neumünster. After you come out of the elevator, cross the little bridge and then walk towards the abbey.

From the Clausen parking, go up the street Tour Jacob, then take the stairs of the Circuit Wenzel that will bring you to the Abbey.
